What an incredible thought that Jesus Christ, while He hung there on a cross, being mocked, tortured and scorned, had ME and YOU on HIS mind!

Most of you reading this probably know the story of the death of Jesus Christ. He was crucified on a cross, between two thieves. I have a book called "A Harmony Of The Gospels" which puts the accounts of the crucifixion from Matthew, Mark, Luke and John side by side. It is amazing to read the details of this and to see what our Lord and Savior went through for us. He was beaten, bruised, nailed to a cross, a crown of thorns was placed on His head and a spear was used to pierce His side. Just before Jesus died He said, "It is finished" (John 19:30). Matthew 27:51-54 (NIV) gives this account of the moment that Jesus gave up the spirit. "At that moment the curtain of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom. The earth shook and the rocks split. The tombs broke open and the bodies of many holy people who had died were raised to life. They came out of the tombs, and after Jesus' resurrection they went into the holy city and appeared to many people. When the centurion and those with him who were guarding

Jesus saw the earthquake and all that had happened, they were terrified and exclaimed, 'Surely He was the Son of God!'"
